On December 1st we proudly launched '<u>Lewisham Against Loneliness</u>', an ambitious new campaign aimed at tackling the growing problem of loneliness and social isolation across our borough.

From now until the end of February we will be using our social media, weekly drop-in and fundraising activities to raise awareness about the different forms that loneliness can take, its various causes, and the many ways it negatively impacts a person's health. We'll also use them to celebrate volunteer-led Befriending and its positive impact on alleviating the experience of loneliness.

Our Befriending service needs your support!

Over the past year <u>Community Connections Befriending</u> has recruited and trained over a hundred local volunteer befrienders. Thanks to their amazing service, 84 residents experiencing loneliness now enjoy a weekly meet up or phone call to chat about anything and everything!
